

## Phoenix 2009 – Protein Complexes in Signalling and Development Registration Form and Information

Phoenix 2009 will be held at the University of Glasgow's Gilmorehill G12 venue which doubles as the University Media Arts Centre. Registration and the delicatessen-catered Welcome Buffet on Thursday will be in the Bower Building, 5 min walk from the G12 venue. Sessions will run on Thursday evening, Friday morning and afternoon, and Saturday morning. Delegates are encouraged to explore the numerous restaurants, cafes and pubs nearby Friday evening and, for those staying on through Saturday afternoon (the Glasgow SEB sessions begin on the Sunday morning with the session on Plant Membrane Transport in Abiotic and Biotic Stress), the Whisky Tour and Walk offers an experience of the Scottish Highlands just 10 miles to the north of the University.

**The Gilmorehill G12 venue** is located in a converted church situated at the eastern end of University Avenue on the corner of Kelvin Way. From here it is a 3 min walk to the Main Gate of the University of Glasgow and the Hunterian Art Gallery (including the MacKintosh Museum), and a 5 min walk to the Kelvingrove Museum.
